Looking Forward to 2027

This just touches base with the amount of work and sleepless nights that have gone into this process of getting our fisherman back on Island Beach State Park.

On March 16th, George Browne, Public Access Chair for Berkeley Striper Club; Scott Thomas of Grumpy's and Yakkity Yaks Kayaks and myself testified at the Senate Environment Committee Hearing and opposed S-303 which was introduced by Senator Turner (D-15) and Senator Amato (R-9). They went ahead and pushed the bill through, but we were told that a meeting would be set up so the bill could be amended.

Paul Novelo contacted his legislator and set up a meeting on March 20 with Assemblyman Alex Sauickie (R-12) and his Deputy Chief of Staff John Kingston. Six of us sat down with the two and they listened to what we had to say. Alex took notes and told us he would draft a bill that would cover our requests. Assemblyman Sauickie has sponsored A-4940 and roughly a month later, a Senate companion bill S-4317 was sponsored by Senator Holzapfel (R-10) and Senator Amato (R-9). Jim Hutchinson Jr. joined us for this meeting and has written a good editorial in the June edition of the Fisherman about this and can be read here:

April 20th, six of us met in Tom's River to discuss our strategies for the future Stakeholder meeting. Anthony Pensabene, NJOA-UCF joined George, Paul, Jim, Scott and myself. The meeting went very well and we had a good idea how we were going to discuss details.

On May 6th, George and I attended a virtual meeting with the Ed Potosnak, DEP Commissioner; John Cecil, DEP Asst. Commissioner; Senator Amato and his Chief of Staff, Jason Smith; Senator Turner; Assemblyman Myhre and Bryana De Veaux, Legislative Affairs Director. At the meeting, all the issues were discussed and we talked about the future Stake Holder meeting.

On May 10th, Rebecca Fitzgerald, NJ State Parks Administrator led the stake holders meeting at the IBSP office. It was well attended with representatives from local groups and tackle shops along with Jen and Charlie from Island Beach; Tom Fote; John Cecil; Jeffrey Brust; State Park Police Chief; Groups represented: Friends of Island Beach; Berkeley Striper Club; New Jersey Beach Buggy Assoc; Jersey Coast Anglers Assoc.; New Jersey Federation; NJOA – United Conservationist Foundation, Inc; Association of Surf Angling Clubs; Hudson River Fishing Assoc. Nothing is written in stone as of yet, but we are looking for 1) unlimited permit sales; 2) NJ Saltwater Registry as a requirement for a MSFV permit; 3) 10 % of sales to go back to IBSP. The need for reservations was brought up and discussed, the group asked a bunch of questions and in the end, they said they will use the 2027 season for taken notes to see if such a system is even needed. All of the stakeholders are dead set against it. For this season, they said that weekday passes will go on sale on October 1st and will be good for the whole week.

I have to commend George Browne for being the 'Go to Guy' who is leading the way, he and a group of us have been non-stop with the task in hand. We ask that you may look up your Legislators at :

Annual "Pete D'Alessio Memorial" Fishing Flea Market

Years ago, the NJBBA Annual Flea Market was run by Pete D'Alessio, and it was an event I always looked forward to attending. When Pete passed, I requested NJBBA to officially name the Flea Market after Pete, and this was approved. In 2025, no one was able to volunteer to run the market, and I did not want to see it missed 2 years in a row, so I took on the task. Early on, we decided to move the market back to the Toms River Elks from Toms River South High School due to the parking problems encountered at the school. I was given some of the vendor lists from members who had been involved in the past, and started working on getting vendors. Things took off when Kenny Hollins started putting fliers in tackle shops, and we put an ad in the Fisherman Magazine. I was nervous as the day got closer since I had never planned anything like this. I took measurements of the space and developed a table layout, and sent this to the Elks. The day before I went to check and the Elks already had everything set up! This made our Friday Night set up easy, all we had to do was hang banners and put out the signs. All in all, we had a total of 37 Vendors, and 80 tables sold, and I had to turn away I think 5 vendors. We had 412 tickets sold, a successful 50-50 and vendor donations for the banquet prizes. I feel that this was a success for the Association, the vendors, and the customers! The Elks gave us outstanding support, and I already booked the TR Elks for 9 Jan 2027, we will probably also get the small room adjoining the large hall. All said and done we made \$4363. We probably had more help than needed for Friday, and the help on Saturday was perfect. Thank you to all who helped! Kenny did a great job of getting the fliers printed and distributed. I sent a thank you email to all vendors, with a request for critique to improve for next year, only one critique, better advertising. I explained we advertised in the Fisherman, Scotts Bait and Tackle, sent fliers to tackle shops, and flooded our social media, and I asked for suggestions, none came back. Next year I will create a "FACEBOOK EVENT" which will get even more outreach. So far I have 19 Vendors and 47 tables requested for next year. SEE YOU THERE!

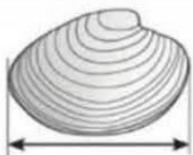

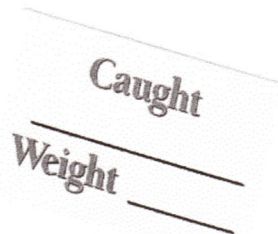

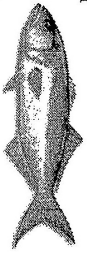

Rules and Regulations

This contest shall be known as the NJBBA Surf Fishing Contest. There is no entry or registration fee; however, only NJBBA members in good standing may participate.

Only NJ Saltwater Fishing size limits will qualify. **NO** undersize Fluke from IBSP or Delaware Bay or **Striped Bass Bonus** tagged fish will qualify.

All fish must be caught by hook and line/rod and reel between March 1 and December 31 from the surf, bay shore, pier or jetties in New Jersey waters (no boats).

Species included are Northern Kingfish, Bluefish, Striped Bass, Weak Fish and Fluke.

There will be a 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize in each category, with \$50 for 1st, \$30 for 2nd and \$15 for 3rd. No participant may win more than one prize for each category.

Prizes will be awarded at the Annual Banquet. Only this Affidavit or an exact facsimile will be accepted and must be postmarked within 5 days of the date the fish was caught. The affidavit must be filled out completely and if not may be cause for disqualification.

Fish must be weighed at any bait and tackle shop in the state of New Jersey. Winners will be determined by weight and in the event of a tie by girth.
